The Local2030 Islands Network is building on the success of the inaugural in-person community of practice convening in Honolulu in 2023, hosting the second annual in-person gathering of technical experts, practitioners, and government leaders from national and subnational islands across the globe. The Communities of Practice gatherings aim to provide space for island leaders, practitioners, and technical experts to share best practices and lessons learned, receive technical training, collaborate, and exchange knowledge and unique island experiences in a collaborative, peer-to-peer forum.

The 2024 event will bring together both previous and new attendees from islands from across the world to showcase progress and action taken on various initiatives since the last meeting, and how the communities of practice have influenced and catalysed change. Technical partners will provide workshops and discussion spaces to support ongoing action by island communities in the fields of climate resilience and sustainable and regenerative tourism.

The peer-to-peer forum will provide opportunities for knowledge exchange, sharing, and technical capacity building on a variety of topics related to the localization of the Sustainable Development Goals as they intersect with the focus areas of the two convening Local2030 Islands Network Communities of Practice on Data for Climate Resilience and Sustainable and Regenerative Tourism. Discussions and training sessions will centre around island strategies and approaches for tracking, monitoring, utilising, and analysing climate resilience data for policy, decision making, implementation and action, as well as tools and approaches to develop and implement sustainable and regenerative tourism projects and practices in island contexts.

The gathering will also explore islands' progress since the last convening, and how the Communities of Practice continue to support the implementation of current projects as well as catalyse new opportunities, projects, and partnerships. Through engaging, discussion-based sessions and workshops led by island members and technical partners, participants will have the opportunity to workshop solutions to challenges and share solutions amongst peers and technical experts, as well as collaborate on a global scale for the implementation and achievement of Agenda2030.
